


#### UNIQUE FLORA & FAUNA

The Gippsland Lakes wetlands are protected by the international Ramsar (wetlands) convention. There are:

- Approx. 400 indigenous flora species
- 300 native fauna species including mammals, birds, reptiles, fish etc.
- Seals & Burrunan dolphins (Tursiops australis). 50+ a
   recently described species of Bottlenose Dolphin
- Birds 20,000 waterbirds such as Pelicans, Black
   Swans, Chestnut teals. Musk Ducks and threatened & endangered species including Little Terns, Hooded
   Plovers, White Bellied Sea-Eagles.


